Beacon Hill Staffing (BHS), a national staffing agency specializing in IT, has successfully engaged leaders from its nine U.S. offices by hosting virtual watch parties of the Simmons Leadership Conference. After attending the conference virtually in 2020, BHS has continued to participate both in-person and virtually, with a focus on maximizing impact through these watch parties. These events enable the team to experience the content in real-time together, despite being geographically dispersed.

What began as a small initiative with just one individual attending the conference has now expanded to include leadership from across the organization. Each year, the senior leadership team invites participants to gather at BHS offices nationwide to watch the live broadcast and engage in meaningful discussions about the concepts presented by the speakers. This format allows for real-time, actionable learning that leaders can immediately apply to their roles within the business.



The success and growth of this highly anticipated leadership experience—characterized by watch parties—can largely be attributed to the strong support from senior leadership. Each senior leader is committed to bringing the conference's insights back to the organization, ensuring their teams benefit from the content in a tangible way. Senior leadership's belief in the value of the program and their messaging around it has been essential in driving adoption and excitement, making this shared learning experience an integral part of BHS's leadership development strategy.

After the conference, leaders participate in follow-up calls to discuss key concepts and ideas, allowing them to address critical themes that shape BHS's culture. These shared experiences have helped establish a common language around key leadership concepts and challenges, fostering alignment as they drive the business forward. As a result, there is now a stronger focus on self-awareness and emotional intelligence, with leaders reflecting on their personal leadership charters and how they can continue to build for the future.

## WHY WAS A VIRTUAL PARTY SO POWERFUL?

Since our participation in the Leadership Conference began in 2020, our attendees have primarily been women. At Beacon Hill, we take immense pride in our strong representation of women in leadership. However, we previously overlooked the valuable insights and inspiration that our male leaders could also gain from this experience. Witnessing their enthusiasm and engagement —on par with their female colleagues — was both exciting and transformative. It fostered deeper conversations, enriched discussions, and reinforced the conference's impact across our entire leadership team."
